Roles and Responsibilities of the First Aider

Casualty Management

- -Principles of Emergency Scene
- Management
- -Primary survey
- -Ongoing casualty care

Responsive Casualty with Suspected Head and Spinal Injuries

- -Head/spine injuries
- -Shock
- -Ongoing care

Adult Resuscitation

- -Cardiovascular emergencies
- -Recognizing angina/heart attack/cardiac arrest
- -One and two rescuer
- -AEC
- -Preventing choking and First aid for choking
- -Ongoing care until handover for casualty whose airway has cleared
- -Recognizing and caring for stroke/TIA

Severe Bleeding and Wound Care

- -Dressings and bandages in first aid procedures
- -Recognizing major wounds
- -Recognizing Severe external and internal bleeds and first aid for these injuries
- -First aid for amputations
- -Recognizing inadequate circulation to extremities and provide appropriated first aid
- -Measures to prevent further
- contaminations and infection of wounds
- -Use of slings /splints
- -Control external bleeding from a wound with an embedded object
- -Control bleeding from the scalp and ear
- -Control bleeding from the nose, gums, tongue, and cheek
- -First aid for wound in the palm of the hand
- -Recognize abdominal wounds

- -First aid for an abdominal wound
- -First aid bites and stings

Burns

- -Take measures to prevent burns
- -Recognize burns
- -First aid for burns

Medical Conditions (Diabetes, Convulsions, Asthma and Allergies)

- -Recognize these conditions
- -First aid for these conditions
- -Recognize fever and fever convulsions in infants and children
- -First aid for fever
- Appropriate medication assist for anaphylaxis, heart attack, asthmatic attack

Bone and Joint Injuries

- -Recognize bone and joint injuries
- -First aid for bone and joint injuries
- -Recognize muscle strain and provide first aid

Head Spinal and Pelvic Injures

- -Recognize head and spinal injuries and the first aid measures
- -Control bleeding from the scalp and ears
- -Recognize pelvic injuries
- -Chest injuries
- -Recognize and first aid for chest injuries
- -Recognize penetrating chest wound and first aid for such injuries
- -First aid for flail chest
- -Recognize rib fracture and provide first aid
- -Recognize blast injury to the chest and provide first aid

Multiple Injury Management

- -Establish priority of first aid and transportation in a multiple casualty situation
- -Ongoing casualty care for multiple casualties

Rescue Carries

- -Principles of safety when moving a casualty
- -Eye injuries
- -Measure to prevent eye injuries
- -First aid for foreign objects in eyes
- -First aid for wounds in and around the eye
- -First aid for burns to the eye

Poisons, Bites, and Stings

- -Prevention of poisoning
- -Recognize poisoning

- -First aid for poison
- -First aid for bites and stings
- -Opioid related emergencies

Heat and Cold Injuries

- -Measures to prevent cold injuries
- -Recognize cold injuries
- -First aid for cold injuries
- -Measures to prevent heat illnesses and the first aid
